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Whenua Iti Outdoors (WIO) delivers challenging and educational experiences in the diverse and spectacular environment of Te Waipounamu – the South Island of New Zealand.

The WIO site is based in Lower Moutere, within easy access to **3 National Parks** and alongside some of the best beaches, rivers, lakes and caves in New Zealand. Add to this a 10 acre, specifically designed outdoor education site and you have found one of New Zealand's outdoor sweet spots.

WIO is an educational, not for profit, Charitable Trust that was established in 1986. Our individualised programmes vary in length from a few hours to multiday adventures.

WIO is NZQA accredited to run assessed programmes that are aligned with the New Zealand Curriculum (NZC). All programmes have strong links to the NZC

key competencies:

- Thinking
- Managing Self
- Relating to Others
- Participating and Contributing
- Using Language and Symbols and Text.

In addition to academic outcomes WIO programmes have a strong focus on critical personal and social development skills.

Design Principles:

At WIO we use experiential learning, a positive learning environment and challenge as our three programme design principles. These three principles are applied by our education team to every programme during the design and delivery process.

Experiential Learning

- Programmes are engaging, relevant and inspiring.
 This includes a system of providing feedback, time for reflection and the opportunity to develop skills.
- Students learn from success, as well as failure.
- We adopt teaching and facilitation methods that are appropriate for different learning styles and needs; we optimise teachable moments; we promote responsibility for learning and enable the development of skills towards the achievement of potential.

A Positive Learning Environment

- The creation of a positive group culture, characterised by positive relationships and based on mutual respect and support is essential.
- Establishing rapport and engagement between educators and participants that engenders trust and

- respect and enables the formation of effective relationships.
- Clearly maintained boundaries are established which promote physical and emotional safety.
- Positive behaviour is actively affirmed and where negative behaviour exists, early intervention is key.

• Students are encouraged to fully participate in experiences which are holistically challenging (mentally, emotionally and physically).

Safety and Risk Management at Whenua Iti Outdoors (WIO)

Safety of our participants is of utmost importance to WIO. Our safety management systems and procedures have been developed over our 30-year history of providing outdoor experiences.

WIO is registered with WorkSafe NZ as a provider of adventure activities.

WIO is fully committed to achieving the highest possible standards of safety and to the continued development of safety management systems and procedures. Our safety management systems and procedures include, but are not limited to:

- An approved Safety Management Plan (SMP).
- A Safety Committee that oversees and governs all safety and risk management practice.
- A member of the Safety Committee (the On-Call Duty Officer) being on call and contactable at all times a
 programme is running.
- A staff competency system based on current best practice or industry standards and qualifications from relevant bodies such as the New Zealand Outdoor Instructors Association
- Risk Analysis and Management System (RAMS) forms for all activities

WIO is registered with WorkSafe NZ as an Adventure Activity Operator (AAO No. 177) as required by the Adventure Activities Regulations 2011.
