## Puoro (Music) Challenge

Hanging with mates and listening to music is great for us all. How about getting a group of your mates together to collaborate on your own music video?

Go all out by creating natural musical instruments and dance moves the whole whānau will love!

# 1 Making your musical instrument

- 1. Go outside and have an explore in te taiao (nature)
- 2. Look for & collect natural objects that could be useful to make sound with
- Once back home, get creative to make your musical instrument/s
- 4. Give it a name, try it out and use trial and error to get it sounding how you like it
- 5. Return any natural objects that don't get used back to the spot you found them

Instrument sounds: drum, whistle, flutes, taonga puoro, string sound, base or treble, beat keeper or melody...

Natural materials to try: leaves, wood, stones, shells, pīngao, water, harakeke...use different lengths/sizes to vary the sound



## Before you start...

Head outside and sit & listen for a few minutes. Look carefully at what's around you. Listen to the sounds your hear.

## 2 Create your waiata

- 1. Plan what you are going to do
- 2. Delegate jobs to everyone
- 3. Do your bit (practice/share progress with mates)
- 4. Record the waiata/rap or dance
- 5. Produce your music video
- 6. Have a good laugh throughout the whole process
- Post it for friends/whānau/wider community to be entertained

#### Starter idea:

If you are struggling for ideas...start with a word for inspiration. You could try one of the following: Papatūānuku (Earth Mother), stars, whānau, confidence, korimako/bellbird, air, fauna, moana, life, atua
